STEPS DON CIVILIANS MAY TAKE AFTER SEXUAL ASSAULT



It can be difficult to confide in others about your experience. Sexual Assault Response Coordinators (SARCs), Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Victim Advocates (SAPR VAs), the Department of the Navy Civilian Employee Assistance Program (DONCEAP) and the DoD Safe Helpline are available when you are ready. These resources can help you navigate next steps and find the care and support needed to heal.

Sexual Assault is intentional sexual contact, characterized by the use of force, threats, intimidation, or abuse of authority when the victim does not or cannot consent. This includes a broad category of sexual offenses consisting of the following specific UCMJ offenses: rape, sexual assault, aggravated sexual contact, abusive sexual contact, forcible sodomy (forced oral or anal sex), or attempts to commit these offenses. (*DoDI 6495.02*)
