Operation Homefront Opens 2018 Military Child of the Year® Award Competition

Six Military Child of the Year® Awards are presented to one outstanding military child from each branch of service — Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, and National Guard. The awards recognize the recipients for their:

- *Resiliency: Overcoming hardship and otherwise working through challenging circumstances
- *Leadership: Modeling leadership in their home, school, and/or community
- *Achievement: Excellence in activities and daily life

Military Child of the Year® Nominees and Innovation Award applicants must meet each of the following eligibility criteria:

- Be a legal dependent child of a service member or military retiree (Finalists must provide their DEERS enrollment form.)
- Be between the ages of 13-18 at time of nomination.
- Travel to Washington, D.C., to attend the Awards Gala on April 19, 2018.
- Agree to a background check (if selected as finalist).
- Provide letters of recommendation (if selected as a finalist).

Parents, siblings, teachers, coaches, clergy, neighbors, grandparents, and anyone who knows a child's talents may nominate.
